7TH ANNUAL DBE AWARDS CEREMONY

The City of Knoxville's Purchasing Department hosted its 7th Annual Diversity Business Awards Ceremony during a beautiful morning at Marble Hall Chapel at Lakeshore Park on September 28, 2022. Nine businesses, nine City departments and one City employee were recognized for their outstanding performance in helping the City meet its core values, which are public safety, healthy and connected neighborhoods, a clean and resilient future, thriving businesses and good jobs, and good governance. Businesses were honored for being persistent and dependable amidst adverse supply chain issues and departments for being intentional to include DBE's in their purchases.

In her opening remarks, Mayor Indya Kincannon referenced that the City of Knoxville spends \$100 million per year on goods & services, making it important how the City chooses to allocate those funds. The City purchases a wide range of products and services, including but not limited to office supplies, janitorial services, capital improvements, security services, maintenance of green spaces, information technology and cybersecurity, street lighting and signs, as well as a number of other essential needs required to run the day-to-day operations of the City.

The Mayor also noted the City of Knoxville understands the importance of being inclusive with small, minority, women, service-disabled and veteran-owned businesses, and businesses owned by persons with disabilities and their importance in helping the local economy remain strong and vibrant.
